Course Description

This course is the second of a two-semester intermediate Russian-language sequence, and is designed to further students' knowledge of Russian language and culture through a variety of interactive methods. The course emphasizes the four primary language-learning skills: speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Class will be conducted almost entirely in Russian. Students who attend class regularly, participate actively, and perform competently on written and oral quizzes, tests, and exams can expect to be able to produce and comprehend both spoken and written Russian in a variety of complex communicative situations by the end of the semester.

Course requirements

Grades will be determined based on the following components:

Regular class preparation, attendance, and participation: 200 pts.

Day-to-day preparation and performance is critical in any language course. Given their highly interactive nature, language classes cannot be "made up" if missed. Poor in-class performance, unexcused absences, tardiness, and late or ignored homework assignments will be noted and calculated into the final grade. For each missed class or homework assignment you'll lose 30 pts. of your final grade.

Excused absences and late work may be deemed so in advance of the class (or afterwards in extreme circumstances); **those who miss class are responsible for obtaining and completing daily homework assignments.**

If you have to miss class or an assignment, please contact me ahead of time to make arrangements.

Homework assignments are included in the workbook and should be completed and handed in daily.

NOTE: After each unit there will be a test, reading, and speaking exams.

Tardiness: Students are expected to be on time. If a student is late due to an unexpected emergency, that student should enter the classroom as quietly as possible. A pattern of unexplained tardiness will affect the final grade. If you are tardy three times, you will receive one absence mark.

Tests – (4): 200 pts.

These tests are designed to measure the degree to which you have mastered the material worked on in the units indicated. All will include reading, writing, speaking and listening components.

Final exam: 200 + 100 pts.

The final exam will be a cumulative measurement of your comfort with and knowledge of the material covered over the course of the semester, also including reading, writing, speaking, and listening components.

Quizzes – (10): 70 pts.
